**DO HEREBY RESOLVE:**

**Rescinding Rama Bylaw No. 77-8: Public Entertainment, Parades and Festivals Licensing Bylaw**

WHEREAS on May 16, 1977, the then Chief and Council of the Chippewas of Rama First Nation passed a Band Council Resolution No. 476/1977-78-373 enacting Rama Bylaw No. 77-8 to regulate and require licenses for the holding of "Public Entertainment, Parade and Festivals" on the Rama Indian Reserve No. 32;

AND WHEREAS there is no current or anticipated need for such a licensing bylaw to regulate public entertainment, parades or festivals within Rama First Nation;

AND WHEREAS Chief and Council of Rama First Nation have directed that they wish to rescind Rama Bylaw No. 77-8 as being redundant;

AND WHEREAS on July 25, 2011 a quorum of Chief and Council adopted Band Council Resolution No. 476-2011-2012-013 rescinding Bylaw No. 77-8, however, such Band Council Resolution was not received by the Minister's office in time to satisfy the statutory requirements set out in the *Indian Act* and was deemed by the Minister to have not been properly enacted, and therefore a new Band Council Resolution is required to rescind Bylaw No. 77-8;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by a quorum of Chief and Council at a duly convened meeting to rescind and replace Band Council Resolution No. 476-2011-2012-013 with this Band Council Resolution which hereby rescinds Rama Bylaw No. 77-8 "Public Entertainment, Parades and Festivals Licensing Bylaw" originally enacted on May 16, 1977.



BY-LAW # 77-8

## By-Law # 77-8

A By-Law to regulate the holding of public entertainments, festivals, and parades within the Rama Indian Reserve # 32.

Therefore, the Council of Chippewas of Rama enacts as follows:

1. Before any person, persons, corporations, organizations or associations may hold or conduct a public entertainment, parade or festival within the limits of the said Rama Indian Reserve, they shall obtain a licence therefore and comply with the provisions of this By-Law.
2. No person, persons, corporations, organizations or associations shall be granted a licence under this By-Law until he or it has , at least thirty (30) days before a licence is issued:
  - (a) Deposited with the Band Administrator, an amount of money estimated by the Officer commanding District Number 7 of the Ontario Provincial Police, as sufficient to provide for the cost of adequate additional police protection during the period of the entertainment, parade or festival, so any or all of them, during which such police protection shall in his opinion be necessary;
  - (b) Deposited with the Band Administrator, a security in an amount and of a kind fixed by the Chippewas of Rama Band Council, or until the Chippewas of Rama Band Council has dispensed with the necessity of such security being required. In any event, such security shall not exceed the amount of public liability and property damage insurance carried by the Chippewas of Rama Band Council. It shall, however, contain a clause indemnifying the Chippewas of Rama Band Council against damage to public and private property, as well as indemnification for general property damage and public liability;
  - (c) Deposited with the Band Administrator, an amount of money to be fixed by the relevant authority sufficient to repair anticipated minor damage and cleaning up of buildings and grounds, after such parades, public entertainment or festival has terminated, so that such buildings and grounds may be restored to their previous state, without cost to the Chippewas of Rama Band Council or Board or body responsible for the administration of such buildings or grounds;
  - (d) Deposited with the Band Administrator, a certificate in writing from the Rama Health Services that all health and sanitation requirements for the public entertainment, parade or festival have been provided;
  - (e) Paid to the Band Administrator, the licence fee herein provided.
3. The fee for a licence under this By-Law shall be One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per diem or part thereof.

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4. In the case of any entertainment, festival or parade lasting less than twenty four (24) hours, the Chippewas of Rama Band Council in its discretion, may dispense with any or all of the requirements of this By-Law.
  5. The Council of the Chippewas of Rama Band in its discretion may so dispense with any or all of the requirements of this By-Law where it feels that the health, safety, morality and welfare of the inhabitants of the Reserve will not be adversely affected by the said public entertainment, festival or parade.
  6. Every person, persons, corporations, organizations or associations who infringe any provision of this By-Law shall incur a penalty of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) excluding costs recoverable under the provisions of the Summary Convictions Act, all of the provisions of which apply.
  7. The provisions of Section 81 of the Indian Act C.149 shall apply to the provisions of this By-Law.
  8. This By-Law shall come into force and effect upon final passing and approval of the Minister of Indian Affairs.
